### MARCH PROGRAM

The title of Jenna's talk will be "Synthesis and Characterization of Piezoelectric ZnO Nanofilms for Potential Use as Electromechanical Seismic Sensing Material." Jenna Salvat will discuss the research that she conducted during her 2017-2018 academic year when she produced piezoelectric nanofilms in a laboratory using wet chemistry methods. The nanofilms that Jenna produced were synthesized using a sol-gel spin coating synthesis method and a hydrothermal synthesis method. These procedures mimic the processes that generate mineral assemblages in nature, such as the mobilization of hydrothermal fluids and their interaction with surrounding rock material or precipitation of minerals from hydrothermal solutions directly.

Jenna has been a member of the Colorado Springs Mineralogical Society's Pebble Pups since she was in 4th grade. Today she is in 12th grade at Coronado High School. Jenna plans to enter college this fall and study geology.




## BEN ELICK INTERVIEWED BY LOCAL RADIO HOST SCOTT SIMON

### SET OF NORTH SEA CORES STUDIED BY PIKES PEAK PEBBLE PUPS

On Saturday, February 16<sup>th</sup>, a joint session of the Colorado Springs Mineralogical Society Pebble Pups and the Lake George Gem and Mineral Club Pebble Pups met at the Woodland Park Library to study a set of cores drilled from the floor of the North Sea. Nine Pebble Pups were in attendance, along with several adult members who were interested in the cores.

John Rakowksi, a Lake George Pebble Pup leader, presented the session and worked with the Pebble Pups during the morning class. John talked about petroleum exploration and the use of cores drilled from sedimentary rock. John discussed the resistivity differences of sandstone wet with water versus sandstone with gas in the pore system. He explained the concepts of porosity and permeability and showed how the well log's sonic velocity readings can be used to derive porosity. The Pebble Pups learned about many things, including careers in geology.


The cores were sent to the Pebble Pups through the North Sea Core Initiative, a program set up in response to the release of core material by oil and gas companies through the relinquishment, abandonment and decommissioning of fields along the UK Continental Shelf. Core material provides an incredible resource for understanding the subsurface and is invaluable to geologists. Both clubs helped pay the costs of transporting the cores to the Pebble Pup classroom from Aberdeen, Scotland.


## Mark Your Calendars!!!

# BRAD'S BENCH TIPS


## PROTECTING FINISHED SURFACES

I figure that any accidental scratch I make on a piece means about 15 minutes of extra sanding and polishing. So after finishing major surfaces I typically cover them with some masking tape to avoid any scratches when doing final work like cleanups and setting of stones. The blue masking tape used by painters works particularly well because it doesn't leave a sticky residue.



## **MAKING A TEXTURE HAMMER**

An inexpensive hammer can be easily turned into a great texturing tool by grinding a pattern of narrow lines into its face. The tool I like to use to grind the pattern is a thin separating disc using a Foredom or Dremel. Be sure to hold the hammer and separating disc steady as you carve, and always wear safety glasses to protect your eyes! For the pattern to work well, a major part of the face needs to be ground away leaving only small areas of high points. This way the high points will have enough force to emboss the pattern into your sheet metal. My preference is to use small ball peen or cross peen hammers. They are quite inexpensive from tool dealers at swap meets and rock & mineral shows. There is no reason to buy an expensive hammer to experiment with while creating your own textures.



### Details on case judging...there are THREE awards that may be given for exhibits at the 2019 show:
